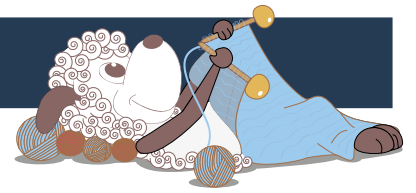


Sarah - a holey scarf

A gorgeous, colorful and fun scarf, which can be worn both in many different ways.

Materials

Peruvian Highland Wool by Filcolana:
150 g for the main color
and 50 g in 6 - 8 contrasting colors
5 mm needles

Size

35 x 150 cm

Gauge

18 sts and 22 rows in stockinette stitch on 5 mm
needles = 10 x 10 cm.

Scarf

Cast on 60 sts in the main color on 5 mm needles,
and work back and forth. Work 12 rows in stockinette
stitch.

*Now it is time to work in squares of color. Knit 1
square across the first 20 sts. Work a total of 23
rows, ending of a RS row. Change color and work the
next square over the next 20 sts the same way as the
first. Finish off by working the 3rd square in a new
color across the last 20 sts.

Change to the main color and 13 rows of stockinette
stitch, beginning with a WS row.*

Repeat from * to * total of 10 times (there are now
11 stripes in the main color). Bind off.

Weave in all the ends as invisibly as possible.

Optional: Make 4 pompoms in 4 different colors and
sew them to each of the 4 corners of the scarf.
